From your president, Susan Gettys:

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your president for the past two years. 2024 was a very busy and productive year. We provided a lot of opportunities for members to learn something new. The board has already started making plans for more learning opportunities in 2025.

Southwest Missouri Camera Club Accomplishments in 2024:

- We gained 44 new members throughout the year!
- We hosted various workshops: Tim Bradshaw – Compositing in Photoshop; Brennen Nicole & Hal Mitzenmacher – Milky Way Workshops; Gary Shaver – Beginning & Advanced Photoshop; and Greg Disch – Advanced Lightroom.
- We transitioned back to a digital format for Quarterly Competitions to save members the cost of printing and make it easier to submit digital prints. We utilized judges from the Photographic Society of America, a free service provided for member clubs. This saved our club \$900 over the year.
- We set up a booth for the second time at the Ozark Empire Fair to promote the club and awarded prizes for the Photography Contest. Our booth included a photo shoot with a Route 66 backdrop to attract people to the booth and have their photos taken.
- We continued participating in the Photographic Society of America Interclub Competitions. We placed well among the other clubs for our first time participating.
- We began a new type of exhibit – team exhibits. This allowed groups of our members to develop a theme for an exhibit and bring multiple photos to showcase. We continued with club exhibits in several area libraries and our bi-monthly exhibit at the Nathaneal Greene Botanical Center.
- We distributed a survey at the end of the year to gather feedback on our members' needs for the upcoming year. Your new board will use this information to plan meetings and activities for the new year.
- We celebrated our year with awards for Photographer of the Year and Photograph of the Year in all three categories and had fun with our fellow club members at our Christmas banquet.

I am looking forward to a new year in 2025 with more learning opportunities for all of our club members. I'm excited to have some of our newer club members serving on our board and bringing new ideas for the club.



FEATURED PHOTOGRAPHER FOR DECEMBER

SUSAN GETTYS

My photographic journey began in early adulthood. Shortly after college, I bought my first film camera, Canon AE-1, and took it with me on my travels. One of the first trips I can remember with my camera was going to Oregon and exploring along the coast. The following year, I traveled to Canada, and I had a chance to go to Ottawa and see the changing of the guard in the capital. I enjoyed taking photos then and wish I could find those photos! Over the following years, I photographed all my travels and nearby places.

When I retired in 2013, I switched to digital and bought a Canon Rebel (I don't remember which number, and I have since passed it on to a family member who wanted to get started in photography). As I moved to Springfield after retirement, I discovered the Southwest Missouri Camera Club and was invited on a field trip to Nathanael Greene Botanical Gardens. The club members were friendly and helpful as I was new to the digital camera world. I joined the club soon after this, and my learning began.



I traveled on my first Supertrip in 2015 when the club went to the Great Smoky Mountain National Park. It rained on us almost daily, but we put our raincoats and rain sleeves on the cameras, and off we went. The colors were so vivid that year – probably due to the rain. I remember feeling like I was being assaulted by color everywhere I looked. I was still learning how to take better photos with my camera. The camera club members on the trip were helpful and patient whenever I asked questions about the settings on my camera.






I started entering competitions to get feedback on my photography. I felt like I had arrived when one of my photos was chosen as the 2017 Basic Photograph of the Year. It was a picture I had taken at Glade Creek Grist Mill at Babcock State Park, near the New River Gorge National Park. I kept entering competitions, scavenger hunts, theme challenges, and any opportunity to gain feedback on improving my photos. I was thrilled when I earned enough points during competitions to be named Basic Photographer of the Year in 2019.

I love focusing on different projects and enjoyed the camera club's participation in the Color Project. I did this for an online camera club that I belong to and brought the project to our club in 2020. Each month, we challenged members to shoot photos that primarily contained the color of the month. Here are some collages from my online project.



I love photographing anything outdoors – flowers, landscapes, national parks, and wildlife. It's a great way to capture sights as I travel. I've been fortunate to travel to Africa on safari twice and loved capturing the animals in their natural habitat.



I've enjoyed attending several seminars and workshops on techniques and post-processing. Greg Disch's Lightroom workshops have helped my post-processing skills immensely. I'm not very good with Photoshop, so there is still more to learn. Here are two photos of Alley Springs Mill, both taken in early November. The first was taken in 2014, and the second in 2024. I think these show the progression of my photography and post-processing skills.



I've been through several cameras and am currently shooting with a Canon R5. I am learning Intentional Camera Movement, abstract, and more creative photography. I just bought my first Lensbaby lens after watching a seminar from Anne Belmont about shooting the winter garden. I'm anxious to try it to improve my creative outlook, especially with flower photography.

Every year, I aim to learn something new and go on more field trips. Unfortunately, this past year didn't lend itself to attending many of the camera club field trips. There is always next year!

2ND THURSDAY CHAIRMAN SKILLS NIGHT

Really?

I came across an interesting video this week where one of the YouTube influencers was telling about many of the responses to their photography segments. They said often that these responses began, “Well, a real photographer ...”

All of this made me think about myself and our members. Are we real photographers? They were saying a “real photographer” only shoots film. I started out shooting film as most all of us did. I was very slow to make the transition to digital, but I have.

“Real photographers” never shoot J.PEG. They only shoot raw. Myself, I shoot J.PEG. I personally hate all the processing, so I let the camera do the job for me, other than cropping and some very slight adjustments from time to time.

A real photographer doesn’t shoot with a phone or a point and shoot camera. I quite often do. I carry a point and shoot with me quite a lot and like most all of us, my phone is placed into service quite often. Why? Because I have one, or both of them, on me everywhere I go. And photos are better taken, rather than missed. The quality from these cameras is quite good and often as good as any other camera could capture.

One of my favorites was, “A real photographer will only shoot in manual.” Yes, I do use manual quite a bit, but I also use the automated settings. Aperture and Shutter priority are very useful at times and I usually use auto ISO.

I know I would have often missed the shot or messed up the exposure without them. I am just not that fast at making sudden changes on manual.

All of this went on for some time with what made a “real photographer.” Criticizing edits, crops, how one makes money or not with their work, teaching others, and so on. And, by the way, a “real photographer” never shares their knowledge.

So, am I, are you, a “real photographer?” I think so. I think we all are. The members of this club constantly show how skilled we are. None of us should ever be embarrassed by our work. However, I believe that often these so-called experts tend to make us doubt in our abilities. For me a “real photographer” is the one who gets out and shoots rather than “Monday Morning Quarterbacking.”

So, get out and shoot, set up stuff to shoot in the house or your studio space. Use whatever you have for equipment and remember the audience you need to please is YOU. I have three point and shoots, a phone and a nice mirrorless. All of

which make nice, clean photographs when I do my part. I am sure it is the same for you no matter what you are using. You get better with practice, practice, practice.

Really and truly, you are all “Real Photographers.”
Don’t let anyone tell you otherwise!

*All photos hung in Joplin, regardless of how it is printed (metal, canvas, photo paper) must be framed. I have seen "offset" frames used for canvas prints and it looks good.

Reminders

- The Botanical Center photos are to be matted with a single mat and a thin backing (about a mat's thickness). The outside dimensions of the mat need to be 16 X 20. Please do not frame.
- For Club exhibits
 - Individuals are responsible for bringing and picking up their photo(s), or ensuring someone will take and/or pick up your photo(s) if you are unavailable
 - May be printed on metal, canvas, or printed, matted, and framed
 - ALL IMAGES MUST BE WIRED ON THE BACK FOR HANGING - NO SAWTOOTH HANGERS
 - Minimum size of Image: 11 X 14
 - Maximum size of Image: 20 X 24
 - Minimum size of Frame: 16 X 20
 - Maximum size of Frame: 20 X 24
 - **Exceptions (larger or smaller) to image and frame sizes must be approved by the Exhibits Chair**
- For Team exhibits
 - The team decides on the theme (except for Midtown Carnegie), types of prints, and sizes of prints
 - The team chooses one member to coordinate with the venue
 - The team is responsible for hanging and taking down
 - The team is responsible for the opening presentation if one is scheduled

It is cost effective to use a standard size frame and mat. Custom sizing is allowed with no approval needed as long as the minimum and maximum print and frame sizes are met.


