




In 2026, America's Mother Road, Route 66, will be celebrating its 100th anniversary. With Springfield being the Birthplace of Route 66, it is the perfect place to celebrate this milestone occasion.

Experience Route 66 Like Never Before:

- Marvel at hundreds of classic cars on display
- Tour an eclectic collection of vintage RVs
- Enjoy live performances from local and regional bands
- Explore the history of each decade along Route 66 through interactive exhibits
- Make a whole trip of it – map out the perfect road trip and encounter all the exceptional towns, attractions, and activities The Mother Road through Missouri has to offer

Leading up to the 2026 anniversary, Springfield will continue to expand its annual Birthplace of Route 66 Festival.

The Birthplace of Route 66 Festival is Missouri's largest celebration of the Mother Road, taking place the second weekend in August each year in downtown Springfield, Missouri.

Why is Springfield called the Birthplace of Route 66

Springfield is known as the Birthplace of Route 66 because it is here where the iconic highway was named "Route 66." On April 30, 1926, Springfieldian John T. Woodruff and Tulsa's Cyrus Avery, sent a now-famous telegram to the U.S. Highway Commission proposing the name. The route was officially approved by the Secretary of Agriculture on November 11, 1926. Woodruff was elected as the first president of the National Route 66 Association in 1927. Its purpose was to get U.S. Highway 66 paved from



end to end and to promote tourism on the highway. The stage was set for what would become not only the country's first cross-country highway, but an enduring piece of Americana that travelers from around the world still yearn to experience.

In 2011, Springfield began hosting what has now become a high-energy three-day festival of classic cars, music and fun for the whole family. In just 11 short years, the festival has grown to attract nearly 100,000 people. The festival boasts 3 days and nights of concerts on its mile-long festival footprint.

Just Interesting

The other day I came across a piece that spoke of “Authentic Photography.” The subject came about because of the rebirth of film of late. Some are saying film is the only authentic photography, and some go so far as saying only black and white film photography is truly authentic. All of this made me think. What makes a photograph or photography authentic? And why not color?

The digital process replaced film, but then we must remember that film replaced the dry plate process in 1888 by George Eastman. Does that mean that we must return to the dry plates for our photography to be real and authentic? Of course, we can take this back much further.

Emulsion, or wet plates, came about in the 1830's and stayed with us until the dry plates came about in 1871. And let us not forget the daguerreotypes were quite common until the 1850's when the wet plates became the norm and not the exception. Are any of these the only truly authentic forms of photography? If that is to be so, then I guess to be a real photographer, we will all need to step back a bit further to Joseph Nicéphore Niépce and his camera obscura of 1816. He used his camera to expose a pewter plate coated with bitumen to light. This plate was the 1st recorded image that did not quickly fade away. This man is also credited for the oldest surviving photograph from 1826.

Now giving credit where it is due. I am no historian, I found most of this history in an article by Liz Masoner. She is a professional photographer and writer. I, and many of you may very well have read a bit of this history before. My problem is that I cannot ever remember some of the names and I absolutely cannot remember all those dates, so “thank you” to the many historians of whom we rely. Below are two of my images. One film and one digital. Are not both of these authentic?

So, is our photography authentic? I think so. The process is just that, a process. For me photography is an art. I can't draw or paint, but I can press a shutter button. The image I place on the sensor, or film, is a way to express myself, much the way painters, musicians, and writers express themselves and their creativity. That is, for me, what makes an image authentic.

I joined this group to learn how to place that image in my mind on a digital sensor, and I have learned a great deal having come from film. Many thanks to all of you.


